 - Scythe - fatty acid, Pethargoric Acid and petroleum component; absorbs leaf tissue, not bark of plant. Will get more use out of this product, has some burn

down, cumulative effect? Used in spring, summer, and rainy season; can dilute 2-10%; diluted will make 25 gallons at 10% strength. Range of use better. F/U on getting information on toxicity of chemicals in Scythe
